The Origin of Whisky

Distilling techniques were brought to Ireland and Scotland sometime between 1100 and 1300 by monks. Since wine was not easily available, barley beer was distilled into liquor which became known as whisky, and where its manufacture was limited to apothecaries and monasteries until the late 15th century.

The earliest whisky was fairly bracing stuff, distilled almost exclusively by monks. It was never allowed to mature and tended to be very raw, as befitted a drink that was seen primarily as a medicine and used in the treatment of everything from pox to palsy.

Whisky was used as currency during the American Revolutionary War and in 1794, Scottish and Irish immigrant farmers in Pennsylvania staged an uprising in response to a federal excise tax imposed on whisky, hence it is often blamed for the origin of Internal Revenue Service we know today.

As a result of the tax imposed, moonshine was born. Distilled by bootleggers who would make and sell untaxed, illegal whisky by the light of the moon, where the darkness would hide the smoke from the stills. The making of moonshine is a hobby still carried out today in many parts of the rural South.

The Club Selection

IRISH WHISKEY (Spelt with an “E”)

TEELING

Since 1782 the Teeling Family has been crafting Irish whiskey and it all began with Walter. In 1782 Walter Teeling set up a craft distillery on Marrowbone Lane in the Liberties area of Dublin commencing a 230 year plus tradition of distilling for the Teeling family. From Walter Teeling to the latest generation of Teelings in Jack and Stephen who are carrying on the family's legacy and forging a bright new future for distilling in Dublin and for Irish whiskey.

Teeling Small Batch (46% vol)

While being very approachable the influence of the rum cask and higher percentage alcohol creates a unique smooth, sweet, slightly woody marriage that sparkles on the tongue.

TULLAMORE DEW

Founded in 1829 by self-made businessman Daniel E. Williams who had worked his way up from stable boy of the distillery to become the owner. Responsible for bringing electricity and motorised automobiles to Tullamore, he created a whiskey so distinctive and character-filled, it could only be stamped with his initials D.E.W.

JAMESON

Triple distilled whiskey like Jameson isn't just born smooth and balanced. It takes a carefully crafted process used over hundreds of years to get it just right. This tradition began in 1780 with the great Master Distiller John Jameson who discovered that three distillations was best for his Jameson Irish Whiskey and they continue his legacy to this day. The largest selling Irish whiskey in the world today.

Layers of succulent fruits from the sherry butts interlaced with vanilla from the virgin oak, balanced with the pot still spice to deliver a silky mouth-feel.

SCOTTISH WHISKY

FROM THE HOUSE OF JOHNNIE WALKER

Originally known as Walker's Kilmarnock Whisky, the Johnnie Walker brand is a legacy left by John "Johnnie" Walker after he started to sell whisky in his grocer's shop in Ayrshire, Scotland. In 1860, Alexander Walker introduced the iconic square bottle to allow for more bottles to fit in the same space. The other identifying characteristic of the Johnnie Walker bottle is the label which is applied at an angle of 24 degrees, allowing the text to be made larger and more visible.

Johnnie Walker Black (40% vol) \$8.00

One of the most popular blended Scotch's in the world

Johnnie Walker Gold Reserve (40% vol) \$10.50

Shows flavour of maple syrup, spices and malt, followed by a dry smokiness.

Johnnie Walker Swing (40% vol) \$10.50

One of the most exquisite blend whisky's of the world - refined, fruity and with smokey oak.

Johnnie Walker Blue (40% vol) \$15.00

The pinnacle of the Johnnie Walker label - best taken with a drop of ice water before each sip.

TALISKER

The northern outpost of Skye's only distillery is one of UK's bestselling whiskies, which once tried is rarely forgotten

Talisker Port Ruighe Single Malt (45.8% vol) \$11.50

Powerful maritime character combined with succulent sweet notes of rich berry fruits for a superb taste experience.

GLENLIVET

Glenlivet - the name translated from Gaelic means 'valley of the smooth-flowing one', is located in Speyside, Scotland. Entrepreneur, George Smith didn't follow the lead of the traditionally illegal still owners and in 1824, obtained a distiller's licence to produce and trade Glenlivet whisky, without attracting the attention of government excise men. By 1950, Glenlivet accounted for half of all the Scottish malt whisky sold in the US.

Glenlivet 12 Year Old Single Malt (40% vol) \$9.00

Smoke, clover, honey and heather undertones - A must try for whisky beginners.

DIMPLE

Easily recognisable thanks to its distinctive bottle shape, Dimple whisky uses malts from both Glenkinchie and Linkwood in its blend.

Dimple 15 Year Old (40% vol) \$8.50

Flavoursome and light, nothing spicy or harsh

LAGAVULIN

Although records show illicit distillation on the same site dating as far back as 1742, Lagavulin was officially established in 1816. Known for its producer's use of a slow distillation and its pear shaped pot stills – its two wash stills have a capacity of 11,000 litres and the two spirit stills of 12,500 litres each.

Strong peat, smoke and seaweed nose followed by nutty complexity and light fruitiness.

CLYNELISH

Built in 1967 in the rural setting of the Northern Highlands, Clynelish produces a muscular, slightly peaty whisky much valued by blenders and is one of the base spirits for the excellent Johnnie Walker Gold Label. Its notorious founder the Duke of Sutherland is famous in Scotland for his part in the Highland Clearances, when he evicted around 15,000 crofters from his land, in order to farm his sheep. It is speculated that he started the distillery to provide a market for his barley and to put the local moonshiners out of business.

Clynelish 14 Year Old Single Malt (46% vol) \$10.50

Bottled at the full 46%, this whisky is packed with power and flavours of spice and maritime saltiness.

TOBERMORY

Although distilling had been banned in the UK in 1795, Tobermory was established some three years later by John Sinclair. Originally licensed to build a brewery, instead he continued with his dream and additionally built a pier known as "Sinclair's Quay". To this date, Tobermory remains the only whisky distillery on the Isle of Mull and is located at the islands most northern tip, within the main village of Tobermory.

Tobermory 15 Year Old Single Malt (46.3% vol) \$13.00

Matured in sherry casks, resulting in fine notes and a delicate bouquet.

GLENMORANGIE

At the end of the eighth century AD one of the most significant pieces of early European sculpture, the Hilton of Cadboll Stone was being carefully carved by the Picts and which became the brand for Glenmorangie Signet whisky. The select craftsmen entrusted with the secrets of the Glenmorangie distillery would queue up daily for a wee dram of whisky with their lunch - A tradition they still uphold today.

Glenmorangie Nectar D'Or (46% vol) \$11.50

A non chill-filtered single malt with rich, spicy and dessert-like flavours.

OBAN

The distillery is one of the oldest still active in Scotland, having been established in 1794. One of the countries smallest distilleries, Oban sits in the heart of the town of the same name, producing a cult, maritime spirit.

Oban 14 Year Old Single Malt (43% vol) \$11.50

A beautiful Scotch showing a magnificent balance between malt and peat.

KENTUCKY BOURBON

MAKERS MARK

Maker's Mark 46 Bourbon is unique in that it starts its life as original Marker's Mark whisky, before being returned to the barrel filled with extra French oak staves for aging.

Maker's 46 Kentucky Bourbon (47% vol) \$10.00

Distinct caramel and toasted oak flavour – best sipped neat and never mixed with coke.

BLANTON'S

Blanton's trademark bottle shape and iconic horse and jockey are a symbol of years of exceptional quality. The Gold edition was crafted for the discerning connoisseur who appreciates smoothness and a clean finish in their bourbon whiskey.

Blanton's Original Private Reserve (46.5% vol) \$9.50

Blanton's Original set the standard for single barrel bourbons. Best served neat or on the rocks.

WILD TURKEY

In 1976, Wild Turkey Master Distiller Jimmy Russell had an idea. He took a chance – adding pure honey to the same bourbon he stubbornly kept consistent his entire career, creating Wild Turkey Honey Liqueur. Years later in 2006, Jimmy revisited that idea – repackaged and reformulated American Honey was born.

Wild Turkey American Honey (35.5% vol) \$8.00

A true bourbon based liqueur made with real American Honey for an exceptionally smooth and sweet taste.

JIM BEAM

Since 1795 (interrupted by Prohibition), seven generations of the Beam family have been involved in whiskey production for the company that produces the brand, which was given the name "Jim Beam" in 1933 in honor of James B. Beam, who rebuilt the business after Prohibition ended.

Jim Beam Maple (35% vol) \$8.00

A perfect balance of warm aromas and a hint of charred oak complete with a subtle, smooth caramel finish.

TENNESSEE WHISKY

GEORGE DICKEL

This famous whiskey is distilled, mellowed, and aged by hand in Cascade Hollow, Tennessee. Unconventionally the bottles use the traditional Scottish spelling of "whisky" (as opposed to whiskey).

George Dickel Superior No12 (45% vol) \$9.00

Considered to be the gold standard of Tennessee whisky, it has an incredibly smooth finish

JACK DANIELS

Jack Daniel's straight Tennessee whiskey is the top American whiskey in the world. Distilled in the "dry county" of Moore, it is not available for sale or consumption within the county itself.

Gentleman Jack (40% vol) \$10.50

Has a unique mellow and smokey flavour from being twice filtered through charcoal

CANADIAN WHISKY

CANADIAN CLUB

Hiram Walker, a successful grain merchant, founded what would become Canadian Club in 1858. The first distillery was established in Walkerville, Ontario because of the exceptional quality of the local grains there. In those early days, if you wanted whisky, you took your own jug or bottle to the local store and filled it from a generic barrel. They didn't care for that idea. Canadian Club was different—smooth and easy to drink and they wanted people to know who made it. So they branded their barrels with their name on it, as a signature of confidence and assurance of quality.

Canadian Club Classic 12 Year Old (40% vol) \$8.00

Delicate spiciness and creamy vanilla, in balance with rich wood and luxurious honey

CROWN ROYAL

Crafted to honour the Royal tour of King George IV and Queen Elizabeth in 1939, this whisky is produced using water naturally filtered through limestone beneath Lake Winnipeg. It is matured in expanding and contracting barrels with change in temperature, which slowly adds to the developing character.

Crown Royal De Luxe (40% vol) \$8.00

Made from milled corn, rye and malted barley, it is distinctly smooth on the palate
